- 1. Introductions for the benefit of new members
- 2. Recycling and compost bin signage
 - a. Signage on 2E has been replaced; extra sign replacements are available from Jonah
 - b. Existing bins on 2E appear sufficient
- 3. Bike publicity
 - a. Received one response from email publicity (suggestion for a helmet)
 - b. Per Loretta's testimonial, the bike is great; tires in excellent shape
 - c. LEC intends to send email advertising bike's availability once each semester, perhaps the first warm day of spring; include potential uses of the bike in this email
- 4. Ecogram/LEC Newsletter

 - b. Could take the form of an email or email with PDF attachment; would go to LibStaff list monthly, library staff being our primary audience; if relevant to public, could also ask Katie Diamond to tweet it
 - c. Sarah volunteered to explore this further; asked others to send her relevant news and information to help generate the content; documenting the process may be helpful

 - a. No official cap on membership; traditionally, prospective members attend a meeting and join if still interested after meeting attendance; prospective members will express interest in officially joining in a follow-up email
 - b. Do we have a description of LEC role available? Perhaps an agenda item for the future?

 - b. Jonah still plans to visit Howell battery recycling location to inform potential for library battery recycling pilot; discussion of placement of potential battery bucket ensued

 - b. Sustainability is offering two free information sessions on starting a self-certification program; Jonah will attend one of these and report back
