

Scholarly publishing takes far more than a village—it takes an international network of peer reviewers. series and journal editors, and editorial board members who give generously of their time and expertise to help authors and the press publish the best books and journals possible. As the press looks back on more than seven decades and forward to the century mark, we offer our profound thanks to our partners. In our seventy-five years, MSU Press has pursued its mission of catalyzing positive intellectual and social change through the publication of award-winning and pathbreaking scholarly and trade books. In literary nonfiction, our authors have


won PEN USA, Pushcart, and Best American Writing awards, and we are proud to publish the literary

Our well-respected list in rhetoric has produced many prizewinning titles, while the journal *Rhetoric & Public Affairs* has long been the premiere journal in the

field. Another of our rhetoric journals, *QED*, has broken new ground in its focus on queer worldmaking. Titles in our book series on the Latinx people of the United States have won recognition from the American Political Science


