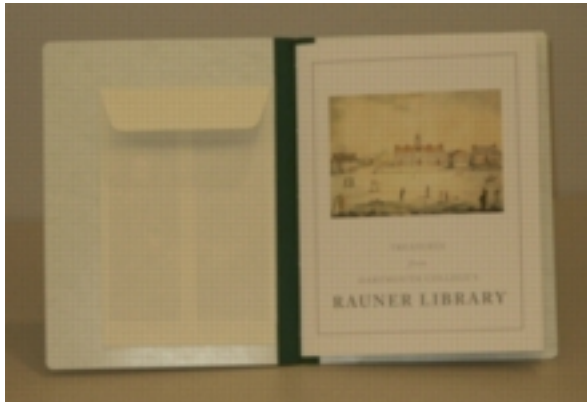


In-house binding - Single Signature Volumes

Center Sew Pamphlet



This is the standard center sew pamphlet used for all materials consisting of folded pages, under 1/4" thick. Two styles of pockets have been added front and back.

Side Sew Pamphlet



The side sew pamphlet protects books under 1/4" thick without a center fold, such as a thin paperback book. When possible, the spine is left exposed so the title can be read on the shelf. This is a new innovation I introduced in 1999.

Unusual Items



Books come in many unusual shapes, sizes and configurations, even within the same volume. This book had a small pamphlet of explanatory material for a facsimile of the Declaration of Independence, which was in two sheets. The facsimile was encapsulated, then sewn into a binder along with the text.

The way things used to be



Two samples of how pamphlets used to be protected and what they look like today. While not all pamphlets bound in the old styles are falling apart, many are deteriorating before they have to. In the conservation lab we deal with many of these each year.
