

MSU Solar Carports

MSU's commitment to renewable energy takes shape in the solar carports that span across five parking lots on the southern end of campus. The solar carports, operational since December of 2017, are designed to deliver an annual energy output of 15 million kilowatt-hours, which is enough to power approximately 1,800 Michigan homes.
